Spring - A time to Plant

April came in like a lion! I was hoping to write an update about how we started planting sugar beets, but Mother Nature has other plans. Cold rainy weather does not help spring planting any. Maybe by the time you are reading this, things will have changed.

Sugar beets are our first crop to plant in the spring. As soon as the weather allows (dry field conditions and the low temperatures above freezing) we can plant sugar beets. Some years this can be as early as Mid-March and other years it can be as late as the beginning of May. This makes it fun to try and plan for anything. Back in the beginning of February, I thought for sure it would be an early spring. There was record breaking warm

temps and no frost in the ground. My husband kept telling me it'll be a late spring. He's good for watching the long term forecast and low and behold he was right. The end of March was freezing with rain and snow.

Once the beets are planted, we will start planting corn and then dry beans after that. Corn and beans like warmer soil temperatures to germinate and grow. This helps prevent seedling diseases which will kill the baby plant. Typically, we plant corn in May and dry beans in June, but again Mother Nature is the boss.

We also have to account for soil moisture when considering planting time. Seeds need water to sprout, but if the field conditions are too wet, we get what is called "crusting". This can happen when planting into wet soil or after a hard rain. The wet soil creates a hard layer and keeps the seedling from being able to emerge. Essentially the plant sprouts, starts growing but dies from lack of sunlight.

I wish it were easy to explain a planter. A farmer's planter is like the ultimate tricked out vehicle. Every single one is customized to the farmers preferences. They come in all sizes, makes and models and can have numerous after-market equipment put on. Nevertheless, the job is to place seed in the ground. This happens by opening discs creating a seed trench where seeds are individually dropped in, then a set of closing wheels pinch the trench back closed to cover the seeds with soil.

We have gotten very precise about it. I mean very precise! We want to know exactly how deep the seed is going, how far apart each seed is from the next one, the seed to soil contact... We can even tell the planter to change seeding rates based upon soil type. We call this variable rate seeding; where we plant more seeds, closer together in the more fertile parts of the field and then back the seeding rate down in the lesser fertile parts of the field. The planter will automatically do this on the go. The technology in agriculture is unreal!

Hopefully some sunshine and warmer weather is approaching soon so we can get 2024's crop planted. ~

What does it take to be a firefighter?

I often get asked by a lot of people the question how do I become a firefighter? It is really a two-part question. The first part is you must determine why you want to become a firefighter. Each person has their own "why" and it is the most important part of the question. I cannot fully answer this part of the question. Some people want to be a firefighter to help people and the community. Some people become firefighters because they were once helped by a firefighter and feel the best way to say thanks is to join and continue the tradition. Some folks just feel "called" as if it is their purpose in life to help others. Although I cannot answer "why" someone may want to be a firefighter I can answer what type of training is involved and how one can apply to be a firefighter.

The application process is different for all departments. However, most of them start with an application. Once the application is filled out, at most departments the Chief will review it. More than likely, the Chief will set up an interview with the applicant. At the interview there will probably be the Chief and his/her officers or some of the senior firefighters. The questions at the interview will cover basic topics and they may even ask the applicant why they want to join. No matter what type of questions are asked the focus of the interview will be determining if the applicant will be a good fit for the department and focusing on past experiences or any type of past training the applicant has had. After a successful interview, the applicant would have to be approved by the fireboard or the board that oversees the fire department. Once approved, the applicant would be accepted into the department as a probationary firefighter. This means he/she will still have to meet the minimum training requirements and the attendance requirements before becoming a full member of the fire department.

The State of Michigan requires all members of a fire department that are 18 years or older take and pass the Michigan Bureau of Fire Services Firefighter 1 course within two years of joining a department. This course is 240 hours and covers all the basics aspects of firefighting. This course includes firefighter safety and health, communications, fire behavior, Personal Protection Equipment, ropes and knots, search and rescue, ground ladders, forcible entry, fire hose, water supply, ventilation, building construction, fire streams, salvage and overhaul, and hazardous materials operations. Students may also take drivers education for the fire service. It is an information packed four-month course often meeting two nights a week and some weekends. Once this certification is obtained it is highly recommended by all Fire Chiefs to take the Firefighter 2 course which is a 55-hour course that rounds out the basics of firefighting. With a Firefighter 1 & 2 certification you can embark on a journey to take many classes that are offered from the Michigan Fire Fighter Training Council.

Once the Firefighter 1 certification is obtained there is a final determination for the applicant whether he or she will be a permanent member of the department. This seems like a complex journey but let me assure you that it is not. Along the way you will have other firefighters helping you and guiding you along the way. It is a very time -consuming process yet ultra rewarding once you achieve firefighter status.

So, now that you know what it takes to be a firefighter. How do you stay a firefighter? Firefighting is a team sport. You train with the other firefighters in your department and outside your department, you serve the community with your time and knowledge, you answer the call when fires or incidents happen, you dedicate time that you know you will not get back yet you are helping pave a path that will continue long after you served. Being a firefighter also means sacrifice, you will miss family events at times, the pager will go off at the most in-opportune time, you will have to sacrifice your recreational time, you will also have to take part in fundraisers for the department. All of this can at times be overwhelming, that is why it is important to never forget "why" you wanted to be a firefighter in the first place. If you are interested in becoming a firefighter reach out to your local fire Chief or ask someone that is already in the department. All departments are always looking for people to get involved.

In closing, I would like to thank Jason Lermont who is not only the Harbor Beach Fire Chief but also the Huron County Training Coordinator. He instructed the Firefighter 1 class that just wrapped up on April 6th. He has spent the last 4 months honing over 30 students into firefighters. His time and talents are very much appreciated!! It is imperative that new people come into the fire service regularly so there is always trained firefighters to answer the call. He has also had many volunteers that have helped him as well, their time and talents are very much appreciated!! Much like firefighting, training firefighters is a team sport!! Lastly, I would also like to thank the Bad Axe Area Fire Department for hosting the training. They regularly open their fire station for training and meetings and is always appreciated!! ~





## What's in a Name?

If you look at a county map, you'll notice that most rural roads are laid out at one-mile intervals. Left-to-right; top-to-bottom; county maps resemble crossword puzzle grids—with one underlying question: "What's in a name?" That's because rural roads often change names at township lines. Don't take my word for it...M-53 is a good road trip to check it out yourself. It's a state highway that splits many townships. If your eyesight's good, you don't even need a map. Just read the road signs.

Townships have the right to name their own roads, but they've been somewhat myopic about it. Some refer to a town or a farm family that once owned a section of land the road runs through. It doesn't matter that some of those towns are now little more than a couple of stop signs. It doesn't matter that those families sold off the land decades ago. It doesn't matter that those names are only known to people who live in the area. It doesn't even matter to us as we travel across those roads (not caring what they're called)...until it does matter. Then the inconsistency gets confusing.

For example, on M-53, Filion Road is Filion Road on both sides and Kinde Road is Kinde Road; but between them, Dunn Road isn't done, it becomes Dobson Road. And while Cross Road crosses, it becomes Limerick Road—although none of this rhymes.

Some roads have multiple names (or local names known only to the locals). M-53, aka VanDyke Road, becomes Lake Street in Port Austin. But in Bad Axe it's named Port Crescent Street and it doesn't even go there. On the other hand, Port Crescent Road, (a mile or so South of Port Austin) does. Not much left in Port Crescent anyway (except the state park and a lot of once-upon-a- time stories).

Getting confused? Me too! Thank you for letting me vent my "road rage." ~

#### PORT AUSTIN - A MUSIC MECCA

When I bought my home in Port Austin twenty years ago, I was completely in love with the town for what it offered back then — sun, water, beaches, swimming, boating, relaxation, a great theater with wonderful productions.
